


Richard RÉTI

- Get at least a share of the centre
- Get castled
- ALSO
 - Threaten to take over the centre
 - Open a file for your Rooks

Being an openings expert

- I believe that all young players should adopt and learn a set of opening systems as early as possible, and stick to them long enough be a bit of an expert in those systems.
- You need three or four systems to cover White and Black:
 - A system to play as White
 - A system to play as Black against 1.e4
 - A system to play as Black against 1.d4 and other openings
 - A system or set of systems to play as White when Black dodges your main line
 - NB you can play one system for both sides.

A Basic Opening Repertoire for young players

- You want a standard opening to learn? Probably, you will need at least four! Here is my suggestion:
- 1) System for White: Scotch Gambit 1.e4 e5 2.Nf3 Nc6 3.d4 exe4 4.Bc4
- 2) When Black avoids your main system:

IQP systems

e.g. 1.e4 c5 2.c3 & d4

e.g. 1.e4 e6 2.d4 d5 3.exd5 exd5 4.c4

e.g. 1.e4 c6 2.d4 d5 3.exd5 cxd5 4.c4

3) System for Black against 1.e4:

French Defence 1.e4 e6

4) System for Black against 1.d4:

Tarrasch Defence 1.d4 d5 2.c4 e6 3.Nc3 c5 or Swiss Defence
